6	SECTION 1. Article 4 of Chapter 8C of the General Statutes, the North

9	(a) For t	the purposes of this Rule, the term 'collateral source payments' means	
10	payments related to the injury, disability, or death in question made to the plaintiff, or		
11	on plaintiff's behalf, by or pursuant to:		
12	<u>(1)</u>	A federal, state, or local income disability or workers' compensation	
13		act; or other public program providing medical expenses, disability	
14		payments, or similar benefits;	
15	<u>(2)</u>	Health, accident, sickness, or automobile accident insurance or liability	
16		insurance that provides health benefits or income disability coverage;	
17		except that 'collateral source payments' shall not include life insurance	
18		benefits available to the plaintiff, whether purchased by the plaintiff or	
19		provided by others, payments made pursuant to the Social Security	
20		Act, or pension payments;	
21	<u>(3)</u>	A contract or agreement of a group, organization, partnership, or	
22		corporation to provide, pay for, or reimburse the costs of hospital.
