5	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-4.01(7a) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(7a)(7b) Employer. – Any person who owns or leases a commercial motor		
7	vehicle or assigns a person to drive a commercial motor vehicle."		
8	8 SECTION 2. G.S. 20-4.01 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:		
9	"(7a) Personal Assistive Mobility Device. — A self-balancing nontandem		
10	two-wheeled device, designed to transport one person, with a		
11	propulsion system that limits the maximum speed of the device to 15		
12	miles per hour or less."		
13	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-4.01(49) reads as rewritten:		
14	"(49) Vehicle. – Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property		
15	is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, excepting devices		
16	moved by human power or used exclusively upon fixed rails or tracks;		
17	provided, that for the purposes of this Chapter bicycles shall be		
18	deemed vehicles and every rider of a bicycle upon a highway shall be		
19	subject to the provisions of this Chapter applicable to the driver of a		
20	vehicle except those which by their nature can have no application.		
21	This term shall not include a device which is designed for and intended		
22	to be used as a means of transportation for a person with a mobility		
23	impairment, or who uses the device for mobility enhancement, is		
24	suitable for use both inside and outside a building, including on		
25	sidewalks, and is limited by design to 15 miles per hour when the		
26	device is being operated by a person with a mobility impairment, or		
27	who uses the device for mobility enhancement. This term does not

Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices. 9 "§ 20-175.6. Electric personal assistive mobility devices. 10 Electric personal assistive mobility device. – As defined in G.S. 20-4.01(7a). (a) Exempt from Registration. — As provided in G.S. 20-51. 11 (b) 12 (c) Use of Device. — An electric personal assistive mobility device may be operated on the public highways, sidewalks, and bicycle paths. A person operating an 13 14 electric personal assistive mobility device on a sidewalk, roadway, or bicycle path shall vield the right-of-way to pedestrians and other human-powered devices. A person 15 operating an electric personal assistive mobility device shall have all rights and duties of 16 17 a pedestrian." 18 **SECTION 6.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
