	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 115C-238.29F(e)(3) reads as rewritten:	
"(e)	Employees. –

	(3) If a teacher employed by a local school administrative	e unit makes a

11 12 written request for an extended a leave of absence to teach at a charter 13 school, the local school administrative unit shall grant the leave. The 14 local school administrative unit shall grant a leave for any number of years requested by the teacher, shall extend the leave for any number 15 of years requested by the teacher, and shall extend the leave at the 16 17 teacher's request. leave for one year. For the initial year of a charter school's operation, the local school administrative unit may require 18 that the request for a leave of absence or extension of leave be made 19 up to 45 days before the teacher would otherwise have to report for 20 21 duty. For subsequent years, After the initial year of a charter school's 22 operation, the local school administrative unit may require that the 23 request for a leave of absence or extension of leave be made up to 90 days before the teacher would otherwise have to report for duty. A 24 25 local board of education is not required to grant a request for a leave of 26 absence or a request to extend or renew a leave of absence for a 27 teacher who previously has received a leave of absence from that

school board under this subdivision. A teacher who has career status 1 2 under G.S. 115C-325 prior to receiving an extended a leave of absence 3 to teach at a charter school may return to a public school in the local 4 school administrative unit with career status at the end of the leave of 5 absence or upon the end of employment at the charter school if an 6 appropriate position is available. If an appropriate position is 7 unavailable, the teacher's name shall be placed on a list of available 8 teachers and that teacher shall have priority on all positions for which 9 that teacher is qualified in accordance with G.S. 115C-325(e)(2)." 10

**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding the time limitation contained in G.S. 135-5.3(b), the board of directors of any charter school that received State Board of Education approval under G.S. 115C-238.29D on or after March 15, 2001, may elect to become a participating employer in the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System in accordance with Article 1 of Chapter 135 of the General Statutes. The election authorized by this section must be made no later than August 1, 2001, and in accordance with all other requirements of G.S. 135-5.3.

**SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act is effective when it becomes law and applies to requests under G.S. 115C-238.29F(e)(3) that are made on and after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
