June 13, 2002 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE TO 3 REPEAL CERTAIN OPTIONAL RIGHTS OF THE CITY MANAGER, TO 4 AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT PROPERTY OFFERED FOR PUBLIC DEDICATION, TO REPEAL THE SECTION THAT PROHIBITS THE 5 CITY MANAGER FROM AWARDING CONTRACTS THAT EXCEED FIFTY 6 THOUSAND DOLLARS, AND TO MOVE A CERTAIN SECTION FROM 7 CHAPTER FOUR TO CHAPTER EIGHT FOR ORGANIZATIONAL PURPOSES. 8 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 4.06 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being S.L. 2000-26, as amended, reads as rewritten: 11 12 "Section 4.06. **Optional Rights.** The City Manager may: 13 Approve the: (1)14 Acquisition by the City of real property having a value of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or less. 15 Acquisition or sale by the City of real property having a value 16 b. of more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), when the City 17 Manager certifies to the Council that the property is being 18 acquired or sold for the purpose of increasing the supply of 19 affordable housing available to low or moderate income 20 persons. The Manager shall, within 10 days of any transaction 21 authorized by this subdivision, report the details to the Council. 22 Approve certain contracts as provided in Section 8.86 of this Charter. 23 (2)24 (3)Approve agreements permitting encroachments into setbacks and rights-of-way. 25 Accept dedicated streets for City maintenance. Manager or his or her 26 (4) designee may accept property offered for public dedication." 27 28

SECTION 2. Section 8.22 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being S.L. 2000-26, as amended, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

"(e) The City Manager may approve the sale by the City of real property having a
value of more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) when the City Manager certifies to
the Council that the property is being sold for the purpose of increasing the supply of
affordable housing available to low- or moderate-income persons. The City Manager
shall within 10 days of any transaction authorized by this subsection report the details to
the Council."
SECTION 3. Section 8.86 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being S.L.

SECTION 3. Section 8.86 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being S.L. 2000-26, as amended, is repealed.

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
