Short Title: Amend Nursing Practice Act. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: March 15, 2001 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAWS RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF NURSING. 3 SECTION 1. G.S. 90-171.20 reads as rewritten: 4 "§ 90-171.20. Definitions. As used in this Article, unless the context requires otherwise: 5 "Board" means the North Carolina Board of Nursing. 6 (1)"Health care provider" means any licensed health care professional and 7 (2)8 any agent or employee of any health care institution, health care 9 insurer, health care professional school, or a member of any allied health profession. For purposes of this Article, a person enrolled in a 10 program to prepare him that prepares the person to be a licensed health 11 12 care professional or an allied health professional shall be deemed a health care provider. 13 14 (3) "License" means a permit issued by the Board to practice nursing as a registered nurse or as a licensed practical nurse, including a renewal 15 thereof. 16 17 "Nursing" is a dynamic discipline which includes the assessing, caring, (4) counseling, teaching, referring and implementing of prescribed 18 treatment in the maintenance of health, prevention and management of 19 20 illness, injury, disability or the achievement of a dignified death. It is 21 ministering to; assisting; and sustained, vigilant, and continuous care of those acutely or chronically ill; supervising patients during 22 23 convalescence and rehabilitation; the supportive and restorative care 24 given to maintain the optimum health level of individuals individuals, 25 groups, and communities; the supervision, teaching, and evaluation of those who perform or are preparing to perform these functions; and the
