A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR INTERPRETER SERVICES IN LOCAL
HEALTH DEPARTMENTS IN COUNTIES WITH A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER
OF SPANISH-SPEAKING RESIDENTS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$3,200,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year. These funds shall be used to provide professional interpreters based in local health departments in counties with medium, high, or very high-population density of Spanish-speaking residents. The funds shall be allocated to local health departments based on a ratio recommended by the State Health Director's Committee on Linguistic Services.

**SECTION 1.(b)** Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Health and Human Services in subsection (a) of this section, the sum of up to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of up to seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year may be used by the Department to plan, implement, and maintain a program to provide incentives for local health departments to recruit, select, and hire bilingual staff.

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
