The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 44A of the General Statutes is amended		
by adding a new section to read:		
"§ 44A-25. No docketing of lien unless authorized by statute.		
(a) No claim of lien or other document purporting to claim or assert a lien on real		
property shall be indexed, docketed, or recorded by the clerk of superior court or by the		
register of deeds in such a way as to affect the title to any real property unless the		
document:		
<u>(1)</u>	Is offered for filing pursuant to this Article or to another s	
	State that provides for indexing and docketing of claims of	of lien on real
	property; and	
<u>(2)</u>	Appears on its face to contain all of the information rec	<u>quired by the</u>
	statute pursuant to which it is offered for filing.	_
(b) Any person who causes or attempts to cause a claim of lien or other document		
to be filed, knowing that the filing is not authorized by statute, or with the intent that the		
filing is made for an improper purpose such as to hinder, harass, or otherwise		
wrongfully interfere with any person, shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor."		
SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to		
offenses committed on or after that date.
