**SECTION 2.** G.S. 14-269(a1) reads as rewritten:

"(a1) It shall be unlawful for any person willfully and intentionally to carry concealed about his person any pistol or gun except in the following circumstances:

1	(1) The person is on the person's own premises.
2	(2) The deadly weapon is a handgun, and the person has a concealed
3	handgun permit issued in accordance with Article 54B of this
4	Chapter. Chapter or considered valid under G.S. 14-415.24."
5	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 14-415.24(b), as enacted by Section 1 of this act, is
5	effective when this act becomes law. The Attorney General shall implement G.S.
