1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO DEDICATE AND ACCEPT CERTAIN PROPERTIES AS PART OF
3	THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE, TO REMOVE CERTAIN
4	LANDS FROM THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE, AND TO
5	DELETE A PARK FROM THE STATE PARKS SYSTEM.
6	Whereas, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution of North Carolina
7	authorizes the dedication of State and local government properties as part of the State
8	Nature and Historic Preserve upon acceptance by a law enacted by a three-fifths vote of
9	the members of each house of the General Assembly and provides for removal of
10	properties from the State Nature and Historic Preserve by a law enacted by a three-fifths
11	vote of the members of each house of the General Assembly; and
12	Whereas, the General Assembly enacted the State Nature and Historic
13	Preserve Dedication Act, Chapter 443 of the 1973 Session Laws, to prescribe the
14	conditions and procedures under which properties may be specifically dedicated for the
15	purposes set out in Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution of North Carolina; and
16	Whereas, over 6,700 acres have been added to the State Parks System since
17	the last dedication and acceptance of properties as part of the State Nature and Historic
18	Preserve pursuant to a petition of the Council of State dated 3 April 2001, and
19	Whereas, in accordance with G.S. 143-260.8, on 6 May 2003 the Council of
20	State voted to petition the General Assembly to enact a law pursuant to Section 5 of
21	Article XIV of the Constitution of North Carolina to dedicate and accept properties
22	added to the State Parks System and designated in the petition for inclusion as parts of
23	the State Nature and Historic Preserve; and
24	Whereas, as a part of its petition of 6 May 2003 the Council of State also
25	requested the General Assembly to remove certain properties from the State Nature and
26	Historic Preserve; and
27	Whereas, G.S. 113-44.14 provides for additions to, and deletions from, the
28	State Parks System upon authorization by the General Assembly; Now, therefore,
