#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

# AN ACT IMPOSING RESTRICTIONS ON THE USE AND OPERATION OF TANNING FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT.

Whereas, on an average day in the United States, more than one million people visit indoor tanning salons for the purpose of tanning the skin; and

Whereas, studies have found that indoor tanning may be just as harmful to the skin as outdoor sun exposure; and

Whereas, most indoor tanning salon bulbs provide a significant amount of UVA and UVB radiation, both types of which are found in the outdoor sun and cause various types of damage to the skin that may lead to skin cancer; and

Whereas, past studies have suggested that tanning beds contribute to the incidence of melanoma, and a recent study in the Journal of the National Cancer Institute indicates that the use of tanning devices may also contribute to the incidence of nonmelanoma skin cancers; and

Whereas, dermatologists across the country are alarmed with the number of teenagers and young adults who continue to patronize tanning salons regardless of studies reporting the link between sun exposure and a wide array of skin cancers; and

Whereas, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports an estimated 700 emergency department visits per year related to tanning salon exposure; Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 104E of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:

### "§ 104E-109.1. Restrictions on use and operation of tanning equipment.

(a) The operator of a tanning facility subject to regulations adopted pursuant to this Chapter shall comply with the following:

1	<u>(1)</u>	Provide to each consumer a warning statement that defines the
2		potential hazards and consequences of exposure to ultraviolet
3		radiation. The consumer shall be required to sign the warning
4		statement acknowledging receipt of the warning before initial use of
5		the tanning equipment.
6	<u>(2)</u>	The operator shall not allow a person younger than the age of 13 years
7		to use a tanning device unless:
8		a. The facility receives written permission from the person's
9		physician allowing the person to use the tanning device, and
10		b. The person's parent or legal guardian remains at the tanning
11		facility while the person uses the tanning device.
12	<u>(3)</u>	Before any person 16 or 17 years of age uses a tanning facility device
13		for the first time, the person must give the tanning facility operator a
14		written informed consent statement signed and dated by the person's
15		parent or legal guardian stating that the parent or legal guardian has
16		read and understands the warnings given by the tanning facility,
17		consents to the minor's use of the tanning device, and agrees that the
18		minor will use protective eyewear. In addition, a person 13, 14, or 15
19		years of age must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian who
20		must remain at the tanning facility while the person uses the tanning
21		<u>device.</u>
22	<u>(4)</u>	A tanning facility operator may not claim or distribute promotional
23		materials that claim that using a tanning device is safe or free from risk
24		or that using a tanning device will result in medical or health benefits.

34	<u>(3)</u>	'Tanning equipment' means ultraviolet or other lamps and equipment
35		containing such lamps intended to induce skin tanning through the
36		irradiation of any part of the living human body with ultraviolet
37		radiation."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2003.
