## **HOUSE RESOLUTION 1198**

A HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO 1 2 PROVIDE FOR A DOMESTIC ENERGY POLICY THAT WILL ENSURE AN 3 ADEQUATE SUPPLY OF NATURAL GAS WHILE PROMOTING ECONOMIC THE 4 AND NATIONAL SECURITY FOR BENEFIT OF FUTURE 5 GENERATIONS OF AMERICANS. Whereas, high and volatile prices for natural gas are negatively affecting 6 7 North Carolina's businesses and manufacturers, contributing to industrial plant closings, 8 higher unemployment, and underemployment rates; and 9 Whereas, more than 60 million American consumers, including more than one million North Carolinians, have chosen to rely on natural gas, which is the most 10 environmentally friendly fossil fuel, for safe, reliable heat and hot water; and 11 Whereas, wholesale natural gas prices have more than doubled over the last 12 five years, creating an "energy tax" of more than \$66 billion each year on America's 13 14 natural gas consumers; and 15 Whereas, the natural gas imbalance is exacerbated by artificial restrictions in development and drilling and by governmental policies that increase demand for natural 16 gas while impeding the development of a greater supply by discouraging domestic 17 exploration and production; and 18 19 Whereas, national energy legislation is long overdue; and 20 Whereas, the most critical cornerstone of the legislation must be to encourage 21 increased exploration and production efforts for domestic natural gas supplies; and 22 Whereas, utilizing sound environmental stewardship principles, new abundant natural gas frontiers can be developed to meet demand; Now, therefore, 23 24 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives: 25 SECTION 1. The North Carolina House of Representatives urges the United States Congress to enact legislation in the 109<sup>th</sup> Congress providing for a domestic 26 energy policy that will ensure an adequate supply of natural gas, including developing 27 the appropriate infrastructure, and that will embrace a concerted national effort to 28 promote greater energy efficiency, producing a political consensus that will open 29 promising new areas for environmentally responsible natural gas production. 30

1	SECTION 2. The Principal Clerk shall transmit certified copies of this
2	resolution to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of
3	the United States Senate, and the members of the North Carolina Congressional
4	Delegation.
