## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A PILOT COST-SHARING PROGRAM TO ASSIST
FARMERS IN THE PURCHASE OF INCINERATORS OR OTHER DISPOSAL
EQUIPMENT FOR THE DISPOSAL OF MORTALITIES AT ANIMAL
OPERATIONS IN AN ENVIRONMENTALLY EFFECTIVE MANNER.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** A pilot cost-share program for the environmentally effective 8 disposal of mortalities at animal operations is created. The pilot program shall be 9 developed, implemented, and administered by the Department of Agriculture and 10 Consumer Services. The pilot program shall provide State funding to assist farmers who 11 operate animal operations to purchase incinerators or other advanced-technology disposal equipment that disposes of mortalities at animal operations in an 12 13 environmentally effective manner. Any State funding provided for the purchase of an 14 incinerator or other equipment for the disposal of animal mortalities shall be matched on a one-to-one basis by the assisted farmer and shall be used only for the purchase of 15 16 disposal equipment that the Department has approved as environmentally effective and 17 as eligible for funding under this act. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall not give grants under this pilot program to any one farmer in excess of 18 thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). The Department of Agriculture and Consumer 19 20 Services may determine a basis for giving priority designation for grants under this 21 program.

22 No later than December 1, 2006, the Department of SECTION 2. 23 Agriculture and Consumer Services shall report to the Fiscal Research Division and to the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on Natural and Economic 24 25 Resources. The report shall include a list of projects that received State funding pursuant to the pilot program under this act, findings regarding the effectiveness of each 26 of these projects to accomplish its primary purpose in an environmentally effective 27 28 manner, whether continuation of this pilot program is recommended, and, if so, how the program can be improved. 29

1	SECTION 3. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services may
2	adopt rules to implement this act.
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
4	Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services the sum of two hundred thousand
5	dollars (\$200,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to provide cost-share funds for grants
6	under the pilot program created by this act.
7	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
