A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO ALLOW A SWORN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WITH STATE, COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO CARRY A CONCEALED WEAPON AT ALL TIMES.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 14-269(b) reads as rewritten:  "(b) This prohibition shall not apply to the following persons:  (1) Officers and enlisted personnel of the armed forces of the Unite States when in discharge of their official duties as such and actiunder orders requiring them to carry arms and weapons;  (2) Civil and law enforcement officers of the United States while in the discharge of their official duties; States:  (3) Officers and soldiers of the militia and the national guard when call into actual service;  (4) Officers of the State, or of any county, city, or town, charged with the execution of the laws of the State, when acting in the discharge of the official duties;  (5) Sworn law-enforcement officers, when off duty, if the agency be written regulations authorizing the carrying of concealed weapons of duty and those regulations prohibit being impaired by alcoholoeverages or controlled substances while carrying of concealed weapons have been filed with the clerk of superior court in the county where the law enforcement unit is located by the sheri		nited eting the alled has soff nolic pon.
