2	AN ACT REPEALING THE E-NC AUTHORITY SUNSET PROVISION AND	
3	APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO THE E-NC AUTHORITY FOR HIGH-SPEED	
4	INTERNET CONNECTIVITY INCENTIVE GRANTS AND FOR JOB	
5	CREATION THROUGH ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT OF	
6	E-NC BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY TELECENTERS.	
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
8	SECTION 1. The General Assembly finds that:	
9	(1) The e-NC Authority, created in S.L. 2003-425 to continue the work of	
10	the Rural Internet Access Authority, is successfully pursuing its	
11	mandated goals, increasing access to affordable high-speed Internet,	
12	and creating 21 st century jobs through technology-based economic	
13	development in the rural areas and distressed urban areas of the State.	
14	(2) The e-NC Business and Technology Telecenters (BTTs) serve as	
15	catalysts to technology-based economic development in some of North	
16	Carolina's most distressed regions by helping to grow existing small	
17	businesses, bringing new kinds of businesses into rural communities	
18	and regions, stimulating and supporting entrepreneurship, and creating	
19	21 st century jobs.	
20	(3) e-NC works successfully with local governments and educational	
21	institutions to strengthen their technology capacities and services to	
22	their communities, making available to the citizens technology	
23	services and resources, training, and public access to computers and	
24	the Internet.	
25	SECTION 2. Section 4 of S.L. 2003-425 reads as rewritten:	
26	"SECTION 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective December 31, 2003,

29 2000-149. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law. The e-NC

repealed effective December 31, 2006. Part 2F of Article 10 of Chapter 143B of the
General Statutes and G.S. 120 123(77), as enacted by this act, are repealed effective

4 December 31, 2006."

5 **SECTION 3.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the e-NC 6 Authority the sum of seven million five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000) for the 7 2006-2007 fiscal year for Internet connectivity incentive grants. These funds shall not 8 revert. It is the intent of the General Assembly that these funds shall be used to allow at 9 least seventy percent (70%) of the households in each county to have the ability to 10 access high-speed Internet services by 2008. Funds for connectivity incentives should be committed to service providers by July 1, 2008. These incentive grants shall be 11 12 competitive and shall require at least a fifty percent (50%) cash match from the 13 participating service providers. Companies must ensure the number of additional 14 households to be served as a result of this funding. The e-NC Authority may use up to 15 five percent (5%) of these funds to cover its expenses in grant letting and monitoring.

16 **SECTION 3.(b)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the e-NC 17 Authority the sum of one million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000) for the 18 2006-2007 fiscal year for continued and expanded funding of the e-NC Business and 19 Technology Telecenter (BTT) program. The e-NC Authority may use up to five percent 20 (5%) of these funds to cover its expenses in program development and implementation 21 of activity areas with the BTTs. The e-NC Authority may contract with other State agencies, The University of North Carolina, the Community Colleges System Office, 22 23 and nonprofit organizations to assist with BTT program development and the evaluation 24 of program activities.

SECTION 3.(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the e-NC Authority the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for competitive innovation grants to e-communities, BTTs, and Local E-government Utilization Program participants for the development of model programs and value-added products that enhance the economy of their regions.

30 **SECTION 4.** The e-NC Authority shall work cooperatively with the following entities to carry out the purposes of this act: the Department of Commerce, 31 32 The University of North Carolina, the Community Colleges System Office, the local 33 councils of government, the local chambers of commerce, the North Carolina 34 Association of County Commissioners, the North Carolina League of Municipalities, 35 the Regional Economic Development Partnerships, local economic developers, and the private and nonprofit sectors. The e-NC Authority shall make annual reports concerning 36 its activities to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology 37 38 and the information technology committees of the House of Representatives and the 39 Senate.

40 **SECTION 5.** Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2006. The 41 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
