AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO ADDRESS THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY NEEDS OF 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY LEARNERS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) the sum of fifty-two million dollars (\$52,000,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for the State Board of Education Instructional Programming, Access, and Support Fund.

**SECTION 1.(b)** These funds shall be allocated by the State Board of Education to support instructional goals and professional development for 21<sup>st</sup> Century learners, as (i) outlined in the publication entitled "IMPACT: Guidelines for North Carolina Media and Technology Programs", (ii) defined in the North Carolina Educational Technology Plan, and (iii) detailed in DPI-approved local educational agency (LEA) technology plans, by:

- (1) Expanding access to instructional technology resources and the support necessary to advance students' ability to compete in the expanding global economy.
- (2) Increasing the ability of the State's educators to effectively use technology resources for instruction and their own professional learning.
- (3) Supplementing, not supplanting, current State, local, and federal funding for technology programs.
- (4) Designating funds for the following purposes:
  - a. Technology facilitator salaries and benefits.
  - b. Technician salaries and benefits.
  - c. Technology-related professional development.
