AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO FIRST FLIGHT VENTURE CENTER FOR OPERATING EXPENSES.

Whereas, the citizens of North Carolina deserve high-paying jobs; and

Whereas, two ways to create jobs include recruiting them and growing them through entrepreneurship; and

Whereas, entrepreneurial growth is more sustainable and accounts for the vast majority of new jobs; and

Whereas, the Research Triangle Regional Partnership, working with Professor Michael Porter of Harvard Business School, identified target industry clusters for entrepreneurial growth in the Triangle region; and

Whereas, information technology and biotechnology are target clusters; and

Whereas, there is a need for incubators to grow emergent technology companies; and

Whereas, there is a shortage of incubators in the Triangle region; and

Whereas, First Flight Venture Center has provided a supportive start-up environment for more than 150 technology-based companies and 500 workers since 1992; and

Whereas, the Center is now home to 33 small companies with a total of 180 employees; and

Whereas, the Center has not received State funds since 2001; and

Whereas, the Center's operations cannot be sustained without at least modest assistance from the General Assembly; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to First Flight Venture Center, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars

- 1 (\$100,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to fill vacant positions and to market the
- 2 Center to attract new technology-based companies.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
