The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to First Flight

Venture Center, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars

(\$100,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to fill vacant positions and to market the

Center to attract new technology-based companies.
