2 AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE DISPLAY OF THE UNITED STATES FLAG.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 144 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

## "§ 144-7. Display of the American flag; private restrictions.

No private restriction on the use of land shall be construed to regulate or prohibit the display of the flag of the United States, of a size no greater than four feet by six feet, which is displayed in accordance with the patriotic customs set forth in 4 U.S.C. §§ 5-10, as amended, governing the display and use of the flag of the United States unless:

- (1) For restrictions registered prior to October 1, 2005, the restriction specifically uses the following terms:
  - a. Flag of the United States of America;
  - b. American flag; or
  - c. United States flag.
- For restrictions registered on or after October 1, 2005, the restriction 17 <u>(2)</u> shall be written on the first page of the instrument or conveyance in 18 print that is in boldface type, capital letters, and no smaller than the 19 largest print used elsewhere in the instrument or conveyance. The 20 21 restriction shall be construed to regulate or prohibit the display of the 22 United States flag only if the restriction specifically states: 'THIS DOCUMENT REGULATES OR PROHIBITS THE DISPLAY 23 OF THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA'. 24

| 14 | (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, for the purpose of protecting           |

| 16 | flags, location, and height of flagpoles are not prohibited provided that such restrictions |
| 17 | shall not discriminate against the flag in any manner."                                     |
