16	(1)	The applicant's full legal name and the name to be used for
17		commissioning, excluding nicknames.
18	(2)	The state and county of commissioning of the registrant.
19	(3)	The expiration date of the registrant's notary commission.
20	(4)	Proof of successful completion of the course of instruction on
21		electronic notarization as required by this Article.
22	(5)	A description of the technology the registrant will use to create an
23		electronic signature in performing official acts.
24	(6)	If the device used to create the registrant's electronic signature was
25		issued or registered through a licensed certification authority, the name
26		of that authority, the source of the license, the starting and expiration
27		dates of the device's term of registration, and any revocations,
28		annulments, or other premature terminations of any registered device

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1	of the registrant that was due to misuse or compromise of the device,
2	with the date, cause, and nature of each termination explained in detail.
3	(7) The e-mail address of the registrant.
4	The information contained in a registration under this section is a public record as
5	defined in G.S. 132-1, except for information contained in subsection (7), subdivision
6	(7), which shall be considered confidential information and shall not be subject to
7	disclosure except as provided in Chapter 132 of the General Statutes or as provided by
8	rule."
9	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
