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2	AN ACT TO MAKE CLARIFYING, CONFORMING, AND TECHNICAL
3	AMENDMENTS TO VARIOUS LAWS RELATED TO THE ENVIRONMENT,
4	ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH, AND NATURAL RESOURCES, AS
5	RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 113-174.2(c)(6)i. reads as rewritten:
8	"i. Resident <u>Elderly Age 65</u> Lifetime CRFL. – \$15.00. This license
9	shall be issued only to an individual who is 65 years of age or
10	older and who is a resident of the State."
11	SECTION 2. G.S. 113-351(c)(3)e. reads as rewritten:
12	"e. Resident Elderly Age 65 Lifetime Unified Sportsman/Coastal
13	Recreational Fishing License. – \$30.00. This license shall be
14	issued only to an individual who is 65 years of age or older and
15	who is a resident of the State."
16	SECTION 3. G.S. 143B-291(a)(1) reads as rewritten:
17	"(1) One member who is the <u>chairman chair of</u> the North Carolina State
18	University Minerals Research Laboratory Advisory Committee, ex
19	officio."
20	SECTION 4. G.S. 143B-291(g) reads as rewritten:
21	"(g) Staff. – All clerical and other services required by the Commission shall be
22	supplied by the Secretary of the Department. Environment and Natural Resources."
23	SECTION 5. G.S. 143B-292 reads as rewritten:

8	SECTION 7. G.S. 143B-296 reads as rewritten:
9	"§ 143B-296. Soil and Water Conservation Commission – officers.
10	The Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall have a chairman chair and a
11	vice-chairman.vice-chair. The chairman chair shall be designated by the Governor from
12	among the members of the Commission to serve as chairman chair at the pleasure of the
13	Governor. The vice chairman vice-chair shall be elected by and from the members of the
14	Commission and shall serve for a term of two years or until the expiration of his the
15	vice-chair's regularly appointed term."
16	SECTION 8. G.S. 143B-297 reads as rewritten:
17	"§ 143B-297. Soil and Water Conservation Commission – meetings.
18	The Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall meet at least quarterly and may

The Commission shall consist of the following members: (1) A person to be nominated jointly by the boards of the North Carolina League of Municipalities and the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners; (2) A person to be nominated by the Board of the North Carolina Home Builders Association; (3) A person to be nominated by the Carolinas Branch, Associated General Contractors of America; (4) The president, vice-president, or general counsel of a North Carolina public utility company; (5) The Director of the North Carolina Water Resources Research Institute; (6) A member of the State Mining Commission who shall be a representative of nongovernmental conservation interests, as required

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(9) A soil scientist from the faculty of North Carolina State University; 1 2 (10)Two persons who shall be representatives of nongovernmental 3 conservation interests; and A professional engineer registered under the provisions of Chapter 4 (11)5 89C of the General Statutes nominated by the Professional Engineers 6 of North Carolina, Inc. 7 Appointment. - The Commission members shall be appointed by the (b) Governor. All Commission members, except the person filling position number five, as 8 9 specified above, appointed under subdivision (5) of subsection (a) of this section, shall 10 serve staggered terms of office of three years and until their successors are appointed and duly qualified. The person filling position number five appointed under subdivision 11 12 (5) of subsection (a) of this section shall serve as a member of the Commission, subject to removal by the Governor as hereinafter specified in this section, so long as he-the 13 14 person continues as Director of the Water Resources Research Institute. The terms of 15 office of members filling positions two, four, seven, and eight appointed under 16 subdivisions (2), (4), (7), and (8) of subsection (a) of this section shall expire on 30 June 17 of years evenly divisible by three. The terms of office of members filling positions one, 18 three, and ten appointed under subdivisions (1), (3), and (10) of subsection (a) of this section shall expire on 30 June of years that follow by one year those years that are 19 20 evenly divisible by three. The terms of office of members filling positions six, nine, and 21 eleven, appointed under subdivisions (6), (9), and (11) of subsection (a) of this section shall expire on 30 June of years that precede by one year those years that are evenly 22 23 divisible by three. Except for the person filling position number five, appointed under 24 subdivision (5) of subsection (a) of this section, no member of the Commission shall serve more than two complete consecutive three-year terms. Any member appointed by 25 the Governor to fill a vacancy occurring in any of the appointments shall be appointed 26 27 for the remainder of the term of the member causing the vacancy. The Governor may at any time remove any member of the Commission for inefficiency, neglect of duty, 28 29 malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance or, in the case of members filling positions five, 30 six, seven, eight, nine, and eleven as specified above, nonfeasance, or because they no longer possess the required qualifications for membership. In each instance 31 32 appointments to fill vacancies in the membership of the Commission shall be a person 33 or persons with similar experience and qualifications in the same field required of the member being replaced. The office of the North Carolina Sedimentation Control 34 35 Commission is declared to be an office that may be held concurrently with any other elective or appointive office, under the authority of Article VI, Sec. 9, of the North 36 37 Carolina Constitution.

38 (b1) Chairman.Chair. – The Governor shall designate a member of the
 39 Commission to serve as chairman.chair.

40 (c) Compensation. – The members of the Commission shall receive the usual and 41 customary per diem allowed for the other members of boards and commissions of the 42 State and as fixed in the Biennial Appropriation Act, and, in addition, the members of 43 the Commission shall receive subsistence and travel expenses according to the 44 prevailing State practice and as allowed and fixed by statute for such purposes, which

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said travel expenses shall also be allowed while going to or from any place of meeting 1 or when on official business for the Commission. The per diem payments made to each 2 3 member of the Commission shall include necessary time spent in traveling to and from 4 their places of residence within the State to any place of meeting or while traveling on 5 official business for the Commission. 6 (d) Meetings of Commission. - The Commission shall meet at the call of the chairman chair and shall hold special meetings at the call of a majority of the members." 7 8 SECTION 10. G.S. 143B-300(c) reads as rewritten: 9 "(c)

9 "(c) The Commission may by rule delegate any of its powers, other than the 10 power to adopt rules, to the Secretary of Environment and Natural Resources or <u>his-the</u> 11 <u>Secretary's</u> designee."

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SECTION 11. This act is effective when it becomes law.
