A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO THE STATE HIGHWAY PATROL FOR THE  
2 PURCHASE OF HELICOPTERS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AIR  
3 SUPPORT IN LAW ENFORCEMENT AND SEARCH AND RESCUE  
4 OPERATIONS.  
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6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated the sum of twelve million dollars  
8 (\$12,000,000) from the Highway Fund to the State Highway Patrol for the purchase of  
9 four new helicopters to replace the current helicopters in operation throughout the State.

10 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-196.2 reads as rewritten:

11 "**§ 20-196.2. Use of aircraft to discover certain motor vehicle ~~violations;~~ violations,**  
12 **assist in search and rescue operations, and other law enforcement**  
13 **activities; declaration of policy.**

14 The State Highway Patrol is hereby permitted the use of aircraft to discover  
15 violations of Part 10 of Article 3 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes relating to  
16 operation of motor vehicles and rules of the road. The State Highway Patrol shall also  
17 conduct aircraft search and rescue operations when so ordered by the Governor, the  
18 Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety, or when requested by the head of a local  
19 law enforcement agency that has no aircraft available for use in search and rescue  
20 operations. Search and rescue operations shall include the search for an escapee from  
21 any federal, State, or local confinement facility. It is hereby declared the public policy  
22 of North Carolina that the aircraft should be used primarily for accident ~~prevention~~  
23 prevention, the preservation of life, and should also be used incident to the issuance of  
24 warning citations in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 20-183."

25 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
