2	AN ACT TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE BUILDING				
3	COMMISSION.				
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-135.25 reads as rewritten:				
6	"§ 143-135.25. State Building Commission – Creation; staff; membership;				
7	appointments; terms; vacancies; chairman; compensation.				
8	(a) A State Building Commission is created within the Department of				
9	Administration to develop procedures to direct and guide the State's capital facilities				
10	development and management program and to perform the duties created under this				
11	Article.				
12	(b) The State Construction Office of the Department of Administration shall				
13	provide staff to the State Building Commission. The chairman of the Commission shall				
14	provide direction to the State Construction Office on its work for the Commission.				
15	The director of the State Construction Office shall be a registered engineer or				
16 17	licensed architect and shall be technically qualified by educational background and				
17 18	professional experience in building design, construction, or facilities management. The				
10 19	administrative head shall be appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Administration.				
20	(c) The Commission shall consist of nine <u>13</u> members qualified and appointed as				
20	follows:				
21	(1) A licensed architect whose primary practice is or was in the design of

24	by the North Carolina Chapter of the American Institute of Architects,				
25	appointed by the Governor.

29	Professional Engineers of North Carolina, appointed by the General

3	(3)	A licensed building contractor whose primary business is or was in the
4		construction of buildings, or an employee of a company holding a

8		recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in
9		accordance with G.S. 120-121.
10	(4)	A licensed electrical contractor whose primary business is or was in
11		the installation of electrical systems for buildings, chosen from among
12		not more than three persons nominated by the North Carolina
13		Association of Electrical Contractors, and the Carolinas Electrical
14		Contractors' Association, appointed by the Governor.
15	(5)	A public member appointed by the General Assembly upon the

18	(6)	A licensed mechanical contractor whose primary business is or was in
