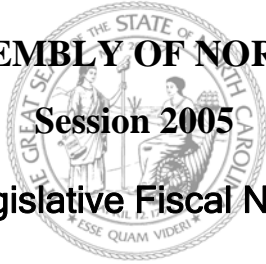

BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 1373 eliminates the \$10.00 fee charged by the Division of Motor Vehicles for the Legion of Honor registration plate and deletes language regarding the Congressional Medal of Honor registration plate, which is included in the Legion of Valor plate.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: As of December 31, 2005, there were 19 active Legion of Honor registration plates in North Carolina and five Congressional Medal of Honor plates. Since Congressional Medal of Honor plates are already free of charge, the fiscal impact of Senate Bill 1373 is limited to the elimination of the fee for the Legion of Honor plate.

Division of Motor Vehicles records show that the number of active Legion of Honor plates has declined very slightly since 2000, but this projection assumes the number of plates will stay the same over the next five years.
