- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
  - **SECTION 1.** G.S. 90-16(c) reads as rewritten:

7 All records, papers, investigative files, investigative reports, other ''(c)8 investigative information and other documents containing information in the possession 9 of or received or gathered by the Board, or its members or employees as a result of 10 investigations, inquiries or interviews conducted in connection with a licensing, 11 complaint or, disciplinary matter, or report of professional liability insurance awards or 12 settlements pursuant to G.S. 90-14.13, shall not be considered public records within the 13 meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes and are privileged, confidential, and not 14 subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for release to any 15 person other than the Board, its employees or agents involved in the application for 16 license or discipline of a license holder, except as provided in subsection (d) of this 17 section. However, the Board may, upon request, allow the patient or the patient's spouse, parent, guardian, nearest relative, or other person authorized to give consent for 18 19 the patient of a licensee or applicant to review medical records held by the Board and 20 the Board's response to complaints filed with the Board regarding the patient's case. For 21 purposes of this subsection, investigative information includes information relating to 22 the identity of, and a report made by, a physician or other person performing an expert review for the Board." 23 24 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
