16	<u>(28)</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article to the contrary, the
17		Executive Administrator and Board of Trustees may discontinue the
18		indemnity plan established under G.S. 135-40, including the benefit
19		structure set forth in G.S. 135-40.1 through G.S. 135-40.13, provided
20		that if the indemnity plan is discontinued, the Executive Administrator
21		and Board of Trustees shall make available on the same date to
22		employees, retirees, and eligible dependents an alternative health
23		benefit option with similar benefits as were available under the
24		indemnity plan, and shall at all times make available to employees,
25		retirees, and eligible dependents a noncontributory plan option. The
26		exercise of the authority under this subdivision shall not in any way
27		affect other provisions of this Article."

1 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007. An alternative health 2 benefit option offered under G.S. 135-39.5(28), as enacted by this act, may become

3 effective no earlier than July 1, 2008.
