AN ACT TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC FROM THE HEALTH RISKS OF 2 3 SECONDHAND SMOKE BY PROHIBITING SMOKING IN BUILDINGS 4 OWNED, LEASED, OR OCCUPIED BY STATE GOVERNMENT; AND TO 5 AUTHORIZE LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO REGULATE SMOKING IN 6 BUILDINGS AND TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES OWNED, LEASED, OR 7 OCCUPIED BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT AS RECOMMENDED BY THE 8 JUSTUS-WARREN HEART DISEASE AND STROKE PREVENTION TASK 9 FORCE.

Whereas, secondhand smoke has been proven to cause cancer, heart disease,and asthma in both smokers and nonsmokers; and

Whereas, the 2006 Surgeon General's Report on the health consequences of involuntary exposure to tobacco smoke states that the scientific evidence indicates that there is no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke; and

15 Whereas, the 2006 Surgeon General's Report documents that separating 16 smokers from nonsmokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating smoke cannot eliminate 17 exposure to secondhand smoke; and

18 Whereas, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) advises that 19 all individuals with coronary heart disease or known risk factors for coronary heart 20 disease should avoid all indoor environments that permit smoking; and

Whereas, exposure to secondhand smoke is costly, costing the nation \$10 billion per year, \$5 billion in direct medical care costs, and \$5 billion in indirect costs according to the 2005 Society of Actuaries; and

Whereas, the vast majority of North Carolinians (77.4% of adults) do not smoke; and

1	Whereas, the 2006 Surgeon General's Report documents that eliminating
2	indoor smoking fully protects nonsmokers from exposure to secondhand smoke; and
3	Whereas, North Carolina's General Assembly buildings are smoke-free; Now,
4	therefore,
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Effective January 1, 2008, Chapter 130A of the General
7	Statutes is amended by adding the following new Article to read:
8	"Article 23.
9	"Smoking in Public Places.
10	"Part 1. Smoking in State Government Buildings.
11	"§ 130A-491. Legislative intent.
12	It is the intent of the General Assembly to protect the health of individuals working
13	in or visiting State government buildings from the risks related to secondhand smoke.
14	"§ 130A-492. Definitions.
15	The following definitions apply in this Article:
16	(1) "Smoking". – The use or possession of a lighted cigarette, lighted
17	cigar, lighted pipe, or any other lighted tobacco product.
18	(2) "State government". – The political unit for the State of North
19	Carolina, including all agencies of the executive, judicial, and
20	legislative branches of government.
21	(3) "State government building". – A building owned, leased as lessor, or
22	the area leased as lessee and occupied by State government.
23	"§ 130A-493. Smoking in State government buildings prohibited.
24	(a) Notwithstanding Article 64 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes pertaining
25	to State-controlled buildings, smoking is prohibited inside State government buildings
26	as provided in this section. As to smoking rooms in residence halls that were permitted
27	by G.S. 143-597(a)(6), this Article becomes effective beginning with the 2008-2009
28	academic year.
29	(b) Smoking is permitted inside State government buildings that are used for
30	medical or scientific research to the extent that smoking is an integral part of the
31	research. Smoking permitted under this subsection shall be confined to the area where
32	the research is being conducted.
33	(c) The individual in charge of the State government building or the individual's
34	designee shall post signs in conspicuous areas of the building. The signs shall state that
35	"smoking is prohibited" and may include the international "No Smoking" symbol,
36	which consists of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle
37	with a red bar across it.
38	(d) Notwithstanding G.S. 130A-25, a violation of Article 23 of this Chapter shall
39	not be punishable as a criminal violation.
40	" <u>§ 130A-493.1. Other prohibitions.</u>
41	Nothing in this Article repeals any other law prohibiting smoking, nor does it limit
42	any law allowing regulation or prohibition of smoking on the grounds of buildings.
43	" <u>§ 130A-494. Rules.</u>
44	The Commission shall adopt rules to implement this Part."

	General Statutes to the contrary, a local government may adopt an ordinance, law, or rule restricting amplying in accordance with subsection (b) of this section
8 9	rule restricting smoking in accordance with subsection (b) of this section.
	(b) Any local ordinance, law, or rule authorized under this section may restrict
10 11	smoking only in:
	(1) Buildings owned, leased as lessor, or the area leased as lessee and
12	<u>occupied by local government:</u>
13	(2) <u>Building and grounds wherein local health departments and</u>
14	departments of social services are housed;
15	(3) <u>Public schools, school facilities, on school campuses, at school-related</u>
16	or school-sponsored events, in or on other school property, public
17	school buses, or at day care centers. Such restrictions may be imposed
18	by local school boards having ownership or jurisdiction over the
19 20	building, campus, event, property, or vehicle; and

25	(d) As used in this Part, 'grounds' means the area located within 50 linear feet of
26	a building wherein a local health department or a local department of social services is
27	housed.
28	(e) <u>A county ordinance adopted under this section is subject to the provisions of</u>
29	<u>G.S. 153A-122.</u> "
30	SECTION 3. Effective January 1, 2008, G.S. 143-601 reads as rewritten:
31	"§ 143-601. Applicability of Article; local government may enact.
32	(a) This Article shall not supersede nor prohibit the enactment or enforcement of
33	any otherwise valid local law, rule, or ordinance enacted prior to October 15, 1993,
34	regulating the use of tobacco products. However, no local law, rule, or ordinance
35	enacted and placed in operation prior to October 15, 1993, shall be amended to impose a
36	more stringent standard than in effect on the date of ratification of this Article.
37	(b) Any local ordinance, law, or rule that regulates smoking adopted on or after
38	October 15, 1993, shall not contain restrictions regulating smoking which exceed those
39 40	established in this Article. Any such local ordinance, law, or rule may restrict smoking in accordance, with this subsection and surgement to $C = 142,507$ only in the following
40	in accordance with this subsection and pursuant to G.S. 143-597 only in the following
41	facilities that are not owned, leased, or occupied by local government: pursuant to
42	G.S. 143-597:

Other prohibitions. 16 Nothing in this Article repeals any other law prohibiting smoking, nor does it limit 17 any law allowing regulation or prohibition of smoking on walkways or on the grounds 18 of buildings."
