The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. Sections 1 and 7 of S.L. 1979-1197, as amended by Section
1.1 of S.L. 1989-1046, is amended by deleting "Craven County Regional Airport
Authority" and substituting "Coastal Carolina Regional Airport Authority."
SECTION 2. S.L. 1979-1197, as amended by Chapter 838, Session Laws of
1985 and Section 1.2 of S.L. 1989-1046, is amended by deleting "Craven County
Regional Airport," wherever that phrase appears, and substituting "Coastal Carolina
Regional Airport."
SECTION 3. Section 2(a) of S.L. 1979-1197, as amended by Chapter 838

- "(a) The Airport Authority shall consist of eight voting members, all of whom shall be residents of Craven County. The Commanding General-Officer of the United States Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, North Carolina, or the General's Commanding Officer's designee may serve as a nonvoting Honorary Member member of the Authority. Further, the Board of Commissioners of Jones County may appoint a
- 21 nonvoting member to serve on the Airport Authority, the Board of Commissioners of

Session Laws of 1985 and Section 1(a) of S.L. 2005-14, reads as rewritten:

- 22 Pamlico County may appoint a nonvoting member to serve on the Airport Authority,
