A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CREATE A CAPITAL MURDER STATUTE, TO AMEND THE HOMICIDE STATUTES, AND TO AMEND THE CAPITAL SENTENCING LAWS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE HOUSE INTERIM STUDY COMMITTEE ON CAPITAL PUNISHMENT. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 14-17 is repealed. SECTION 2. Article 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:	
"§ 14-17.2 Capital murder; punishment.	
(a) The following offenses shall constitute capital murder:

The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of a State or local law 1 (6) 2 enforcement officer, or any law enforcement officer of another state or 3 the United States, employee of the Department of Correction, jailer, 4 fireman, judge or justice, former judge or justice, prosecutor or former 5 prosecutor, juror or former juror, or witness or former witness against 6 the defendant, while engaged in the performance of his or her official 7 duties or because of the exercise of his or her official duties. 8 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of more than one <u>(7)</u> 9 person as a part of the same act or transaction or more than one person 10 within a three-year period. 11 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person in the (8) 12 commission of, or attempted commission of, the trafficking of a controlled substance, in violation of Chapter 90 of the General 13 14 Statutes, when such killing is for the purpose of furthering the 15 commission, or attempted commission, of such offense. The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person by 16 (9) 17 another pursuant to the direction or order of one who is engaged in a 18 continuing criminal enterprise, as defined in G.S. 90-95.1. 19 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of a pregnant woman (10)20 by one who knows that the woman is pregnant and has the intent to 21 cause the involuntary termination of the woman's pregnancy without a 22 live birth. 23 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of a person under the (11)24 age of 14 by a person age 21 or older. 25 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person by (12)26 another in the commission of, or attempted commission of, an act of 27 terrorism as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2331(5). 28 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person (13)29 committed by a person who had been previously convicted of another capital felony or had been previously adjudicated delinquent in a 30 31 juvenile proceeding for committing an offense that would be a capital 32 felony if committed by an adult. The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person 33 (14)34 committed by a person who had been previously convicted of a felony 35 involving the use or threat of violence to the person or had been 36 previously adjudicated delinquent in a juvenile proceeding for 37 committing an offense that would be a Class A, B1, B2, C, D, or E 38 felony involving the use or threat of violence to the person if the offense had been committed by an adult. 39 40 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person where (15)41 the murder is especially heinous, atrocious, or cruel. 42 The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person where (16)43 the defendant knowingly created a great risk of death to more than one

- person by means of a weapon or device which would normally be hazardous to the lives of more than one person.
 - (17) The willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing of any person where the murder for which the defendant stands convicted was part of a course of conduct in which the defendant engaged and which included the commission by the defendant of other crimes of violence against another person or persons.
 - (b) An offense under this section shall be deemed to be a Class A felony, and any person who commits capital murder shall be punished with death or imprisonment in the State's prison for life without parole, as the court shall determine pursuant to G.S. 15A-2000, except as provided in subsection (c) of this section.
 - (c) Any person who commits an offense in violation of this section who was under 18 years of age at the time of the capital murder shall be punished with imprisonment in the State's prison for life without parole."

SECTION 3. Article 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-17.3. First degree murder; punishment.


- (a) Murder, other than capital murder, by means of a nuclear, biological, or chemical weapon of mass destruction as defined in G.S. 14-288.21, poison, lying in wait, imprisonment, starving, torture, or by any other kind of willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing, or which shall be committed in the perpetration or attempted perpetration of any arson, rape or a sex offense, robbery, kidnapping, burglary, or other felony committed or attempted with the use of a deadly weapon, except as provided in G.S. 14-17.2, shall be deemed murder in the first degree.
- (b) An offense under this section shall be a Class A felony, and any person who commits first degree murder shall be punished with imprisonment in the State's prison for life without parole."
- **SECTION 4.** Article 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-17.4. Second degree murder; punishment.

Any murder other than capital murder or first degree murder, including that which shall be proximately caused by the unlawful distribution of opium or any synthetic or natural salt, compound, derivative, or preparation of opium, or cocaine or other substance described in G.S. 90-90(1)d., or methamphetamine, when the ingestion of such substance causes the death of the user, shall be deemed murder in the second degree, and any person who commits such murder shall be punished as a Class B2 felon."

SECTION 5. G.S. 15A-2000(e) reads as rewritten:

- "(e) Aggravating Circumstances. Aggravating circumstances which may be considered shall be limited to the following: factors enumerated in this subsection. The penalty of death shall not be imposed unless the State shall prove beyond a reasonable doubt at least one of the following:
 - (1) There is a probability based upon evidence of the prior history of the defendant or of the circumstances surrounding the commission of the



of murder in the first degree. capital murder."

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SECTION 7. This act becomes effective December 1, 2007, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date. Prosecutions for offenses committed before the effective date of this act are not abated or affected by this act, and the statutes that would be applicable but for this act remain applicable to those prosecutions. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this act that can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.
