HOUSE BILL 951*

Short Title: NC Trading Path Trails Funds. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Allen, Holliman, Wilkins, Alexander (Primary Sponsors); Bordsen, Brown, Dockham, Dollar, Faison, and Sutton. Referred to: Appropriations. March 22, 2007 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF TRADING PATH TRAILS. Whereas, North Carolina constituted England's first frontier in North America, a frontier that lasted from 1585 until the Revolutionary War; and Whereas, native and colonial trade roads and routes facilitated commerce and migration into and out of that frontier; and Whereas, numerous remnants of those old paths persist to this day, 9 particularly in North Carolina's rural areas; and 10 Whereas, most history subsequent to the colonial era, including both the 11 Revolutionary War and the Civil War, occurred on or near those ancient trading paths; 12 and 13 Whereas, development of colonial and precolonial era artifact sites for 14 tourism can be accomplished at very slight expense; and 15 Whereas, the Trading Path Association has devised a Trading Path Trails 16 program to bring tourists to these sites; and Whereas, these trading paths led to the development of settlements, towns, 18 and cities throughout the State; and Whereas, the preservation of the trading paths is closely tied to heritage 20 tourism; Now, therefore, The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 22 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Trading 23 Path Association, Inc., a nonprofit organization, the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year for the development of Trading Path 24 25 Trails, a heritage tourism development and marketing project. **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
