2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A CONSUMER PROTECTION

5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
7	Department of Justice the sum of thirty-three thousand two hundred twelve dollars (\$33,
8	212) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of fifty-one thousand two hundred forty
9	dollars (\$51,240) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to establish and support a consumer
10	protection specialist position in the Department of Justice. The consumer protection
11	specialist shall be responsible for:
12	(1) Coordinating consumer complaints from military personnel and their
13	families.
14	(2) Providing a single point of contact in the Consumer Protection
15	Division for military personnel, their families, and military attorneys.
16	(3) Communicating with military bases in North Carolina on a regular
17	basis to inform the appropriate military offices of the services provided
18	by the Consumer Protection Division, to discover new complaints, and
19	to follow up on cases initiated by military personnel or their families
20	through military offices.
21	SECTION 2. The Department of Justice shall report to the General
22	Assembly by March 1, 2009, on the consumer protection accomplishments of the new
23	position established by this act. The report shall be submitted to the Chairs of the
24	Justice and Public Safety Subcommittee of the Joint Legislative Commission on
25	Governmental Operations, the Chairs of the House of Representatives and Senate
26	Appropriations Committees, the Chairs of the House of Representatives Appropriations

- 1 Subcommittee on Justice and Public Safety, the Chairs of the Senate Appropriations
- 2 Committee on Justice and Public Safety, and the Chairs of the Homeland Security,
- 3 Military and Veterans Affairs Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 4 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
