19		less than 54 years old expires eight years after the date of issuance.on
20		the birthday of the licensee in the eighth year after issuance. A drivers
21		license issued to a person at least 54 years old expires five years after
22		the date of issuance.on the birthday of the licensee in the fifth year
23		after issuance.
24	<u>(2a)</u>	Duration of renewed licenses A renewed drivers license that was
25		issued by the Division to a person at least 18 years old but less than 54
26		years old expires eight years after the expiration date of the license that
27		is renewed. A renewed drivers license that was issued by the Division

2		date of the license that is renewed.
3	(3)	Duration of license.license for certain other drivers A drivers license
4		that was issued by the Division and is renewed by the Division expires
5		at the end of the period provided by this subsection after the expiration
6		date of the license that is renewed The durations listed in subdivisions
7		(1), (2), and (2a) of this subsection are valid unless the Division
8		determines that a license of shorter duration should be issued when the
9		applicant holds a visa of limited duration from the United States
10		Department of Homeland Security, but in no event shall the license
11		expire later than the applicant's lawful presence in the United States. A
12		person may apply to the Division to renew a license during the
13		180 day period before the license expires. The Division may not
14		accept an application for renewal made before the 180 day period
15		begins.
16	<u>(3a)</u>	When to renew. – A person may apply to the Division to renew a
17		license during the 180-day period before the license expires. The
18		Division may not accept an application for renewal made before the
19		<u>180-day period begins.</u>
20	(4)	Renewal by mail. – The Division may renew by mail a drivers license
21		issued by the Division to a person who meets any of the following
22		descriptions:
23		a. Is serving on active duty in the armed forces of the United
24		States and is stationed outside this State.
25		b. Is a resident of this State and has been residing outside the State
26		for at least 30 continuous days.
27		When renewing a license by mail, the Division may waive the
28		examination that would otherwise be required for the renewal and may
29		impose any conditions it finds advisable. A license renewed by mail is
30		a temporary license that expires 60 days after the person to whom it is
31		issued returns to this State.
32	(5)	(Effective July 1, 2008) License to be sent by mail. – The Division
33		shall issue to the applicant a temporary driving certificate valid for 20
34		days, unless the applicant is applying for renewal by mail under
35		subdivision (4) of this subsection. The temporary driving certificate
36		shall be valid for driving purposes only and shall not be valid for
37		identification purposes. The Division shall produce the applicant's
38		drivers license at a central location and send it to the applicant by
39		first-class mail at the residence address provided by the applicant.

20	license of limited duration, under subsection (f) of this section, to an applicant present in
21	the United States under a valid visa issued to the applicant by the United States
22	Department of Homeland Security if the applicant presents that valid visa.who holds
23	valid documentation issued by, or under the authority of, the United States government
24	that demonstrates the applicant's legal presence of limited duration in the United States
25	if the applicant presents that valid documentation and meets all other requirements for a
26	license of limited duration."
27	<b>SECTION 4.</b> G.S. 20-4.01 reads as rewritten:
28	"§ 20-4.01. Definitions.
29	Unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply throughout
30	this Chapter to the defined words and phrases and their cognates:

32	(2) Canceled. – As applied to drivers' licenses and permits, a declaration
33	that a license or permit which was issued through error or fraud-fraud,
34	or to which G.S. 20-15(a)(3) applies, is void and terminated.

37	"§ 20-15. Authority of Division to cancel license or endorsement.
38	(a) The Division shall have authority to cancel any driver's license upon
39	determining that the licensee was not entitled to the issuance thereof hereunder, or that
40	said licensee failed to give the required or correct information in his application, or
41	committed fraud in making such application.any of the following:
42	(1) The licensee was not entitled to the issuance of the license under this
