| AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT GLASS VIALS THAT ARE A CERTAIN LENGT AND DIAMETER THAT MAY BE USED AS DRUG PARAPHERNALIA AN CIGARETTE WRAPPING PAPERS SHALL BE SOLD FROM BEHIND TH COUNTER AND TO REQUIRE THAT A PURCHASER PROVIDE CERTAI IDENTIFYING INFORMATION WHEN PURCHASING THESE PRODUCTS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding new Article to read: "<u>Article 5F.</u> "<u>Control of Certain Products That May Be Used as Drug Paraphernalia.</u> <u>\$90-113.80. Restriction on sales of certain products that may be used as drug</u> paraphernalia. (a) The following definitions apply in this section: (1) Glass vial. – Tubes of glass, including those that often hold novel items, that are two to six inches long and one-eighth inch there-fourth inch in diameter that may be used as drug stems. (2) Retailer. – An individual or entity that is the general owner of a |

| 27 wrapping papers to the consumer for a period of two years from the date of each |

| 7 | (a) If a retailer willfully and knowingly violates the provisions of |
| 8 | G.S. 90-113.80, the retailer shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor for the first offense |
| 9 | and a Class 1 misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. A retailer convicted of a |
| 10 | third offense occurring on the premises of a single establishment shall be prohibited |
| 11 | from making glass vials available for sale at that establishment. |
| 12 | (b) Any purchaser or employee who willfully and knowingly violates |
| 13 | G.S. 90-113.80 shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor for the first offense, a Class 2 |
| 14 | misdemeanor for a second offense, and a Class 1 misdemeanor for a third or subsequent |

| 24 | A retailer or an employee of the retailer who, reasonably and in good faith, reports to |
| 25 | any law enforcement agency any alleged criminal activity related to the sale or purchase |
| 26 | of glass vials or cigarette wrapping papers, or who refuses to sell a glass vial or cigarette |
| 27 | wrapping papers to a person reasonably believed to be purchasing one of those products |
| 28 | to be used as drug paraphernalia, is immune from civil liability for that conduct except |
| 29 | in cases of willful misconduct. No retailer shall retaliate in any manner against any |
| 30 | employee of the establishment for a report made in good faith to any law enforcement |
| 31 | agency concerning alleged criminal activity related to the sale or purchase of glass vials |
| 32 | or cigarette wrapping papers." |
