5	The General As	sembly of North Carolina enacts:	
6	SEC	<b>FION 1.</b> Legislative Findings. – It is hereby determined and declared as	
7	a matter of legislative finding that:		
8	(1)	Flooding caused by the construction of Fontana Dam destroyed a road	
9		that had been constructed with road bonds which had been assumed by	
10		Swain County.	
11	(2)	The United States Department of Interior and the Tennessee Valley	
12		Authority entered into an agreement in 1943 with Swain County and	
13		the State of North Carolina to compensate Swain County for this loss	
14		by, among other obligations, constructing a new road, which would	
15		traverse the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.	
16	(3)	The promised road has not been built. Early attempts to construct the	
17		road were abandoned by the National Park Service because of the	
18		expense involved and concerns about environmental impacts.	
19	(4)	In 2007, the National Park Service concluded, after completing a full	
20		environmental impact statement of the road proposal, that construction	
21		of the road would have unacceptable impacts to the natural	
22		environment in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. The	
23		National Park Service instead has endorsed an alternative proposal,	
24		also supported by Swain County, to negotiate a monetary settlement of	
25		the United States' unfulfilled obligations under its 1943 agreement	
26		with Swain County.

1	(5)	The proposed monetary settlement of the 1943 agreement between
2		Swain County and the United States Department of Interior is an
3		unprecedented opportunity to provide for the future prosperity of the
4		people of Swain County.
5	(6)	Appropriate fiscal management of this significant monetary settlement
6		requires authority and programs not currently provided by North
7		Carolina law.
8	(7)	The Swain County Board of Commissioners has by resolution
9		announced its desire and intention that the proceeds of any monetary
10		settlement with the United States be managed for the long-term
11		prosperity of the people of Swain County.
12	(8)	The Swain County Board of Commissioners has by resolution
13		announced its desire and intention that the proceeds of a monetary
14		settlement with the United States Department of Interior be preserved
15		and insulated from improvident expenditure.

22		Swain County Settlement Trust Fund is established as a special fund in
23		e State Treasurer under the management of the Treasurer. The Fund shall
24	-	roceeds of any payments made by the United States in settlement of the
25	1943 agreemen	t between Swain County and the United States Department of Interior,
26	such other cont	ributions as Swain County or other entities may choose to make to the
27		nterest and other investment income earned by the Fund. Contributions
28	to the Fund are	irrevocable. Assets in the Fund may be disbursed only to Swain County.
29	<u>(b)</u> <u>On su</u>	ich schedule as the State Treasurer may determine, in consultation with
30	the Board of C	commissioners of Swain County, the State Treasurer shall disburse to
31		amounts requested by the Swain County Board of Commissioners
32	*	ajority vote of that body, provided that disbursements to Swain County
33	under this subse	ection in any fiscal year shall not exceed the total interest and investment
34	income earned	by the Fund in that fiscal year. At the start of each fiscal year, the State
35	Treasurer shall	issue a nonbinding opinion and recommendation to the Swain County
36	Board of Comm	nissioners suggesting an appropriate amount of interest and investment
37	income to be re	einvested in the Fund to ensure that the principal investment grows to
38	keep pace with	inflation.
39	<u>(c)</u> <u>No p</u>	ortion of the principal balance of the Fund may be disbursed to Swain
40	County absent a	request by the Swain County Board of Commissioners accompanied by
41		y the Swain County Board of Elections that two-thirds of the registered
42		County voted in favor of the disbursement and subsequent expenditure
43	of the amount re	equested in a referendum conducted under subsection (h) of this section.

1	(d) Funds disbursed to Swain County under subsections (b) or (c) of this section		
2	shall be managed by the county in accordance with the requirements of the Local		
3	Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act as amended from time to time.		
4	(e) No part of the principal of the Swain County Settlement Trust Fund or of any		
5	interest or other income earned on that principal may be paid to or received by any		
6	agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with negotiating the		
7	settlement agreement between Swain County and the United States Department of		
8	Interior or obtaining the monetary settlement from the United States.		
9	(f) The Board of Commissioners of Swain County may direct the Swain County		
10	Board of Elections to conduct an advisory referendum on the question of whether any		
11	portion of the principal of the Fund should be disbursed to and expended by the county		
12	for a particular purpose. The election shall be held on a date jointly agreed upon by the		
13	two boards, which may be the same day as any other referendum or election in the		
14	county, but may not otherwise be during the period beginning 30 days before and		
15	ending 30 days after the day of any other referendum or election to be conducted by the		
16	board of elections and already validly called or scheduled by law. The election shall be		
17	held in accordance with the procedures of G.S. 163-287. The question to be presented		
18	on the ballot shall disclose the specific purpose proposed for expenditure of the		
19	principal investment of the Trust Fund and the amount proposed for expenditure.		
20	(g) The Swain County Settlement Trust Fund is subject to the oversight of the		
21	State Auditor pursuant to Article 5A of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes.		
22	(h) The Swain County Settlement Trust Fund and the income therefrom shall not		
23	take the place of or be counted against any other State appropriations or program		
24	providing funds or disbursements to Swain County."		
25	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
