9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	SECTION 1. G.S. 166A-14 reads as rewritten:
11	"§ 166A-14. Immunity and exemption.
12	(a) All functions hereunder and all other activities relating to emergency
13	management are hereby declared to be governmental functions. Neither the State nor
14	any political subdivision thereof, nor, except in cases of willful misconduct, gross
15	negligence or bad faith, any emergency management worker worker, firm, partnership,
16	association, or corporation complying with or reasonably attempting to comply with this
17	Article or any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this
18	Article or pursuant to any ordinance relating to any emergency management measures
19	enacted by any political subdivision of the State, shall be liable for the death of or injury
20	to persons, or for damage to property as a result of any such activity.
21	(a1) The immunity provided to firms, partnerships, associations, or corporations,
22	under subsection (a) of this section is subject to all of the following conditions:
23	(1) The immunity applies only when the firm, partnership, association, or
24	corporation is acting without compensation or with compensation
25	limited to no more than actual expenses, and one of the following

40 (d) As used in this section, the term "emergency management worker" shall 41 include any full or part-time paid, volunteer or auxiliary employee of this State or other 42 states, territories, possessions or the District of Columbia, of the federal government or 43 any neighboring country or of any political subdivision thereof or of any agency or 44 organization performing emergency management services at any place in this State, subject to the order or control of or pursuant to a request of the State government or any political subdivision thereof. The term "emergency management worker" under this section shall also include any health care worker performing health care services as a member of a hospital-based or county-based State Medical Assistance Team designated by the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services and any person performing emergency health care services under G.S. 90-12.2.
(e) Any emergency management worker, as defined in this section, performing emergency management services at any place in this State pursuant to agreements

8 emergency management services at any place in this State pursuant to agreements, 9 compacts or arrangements for mutual aid and assistance to which the State or a political 10 subdivision thereof is a party, shall possess the same powers, duties, immunities and 11 privileges the person would ordinarily possess if performing duties in the State, or 12 political subdivision thereof in which normally employed or rendering services."

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
