A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO DIRECT THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA TO STUDY THE IMPACTS OF RAISING THE COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE AGE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL ATTENDANCE FROM SIXTEEN TO SEVENTEEN OR EIGHTEEN, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON DROPOUT PREVENTION AND HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION.	
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina,	
in coordination with the Department of Public Instruction, shall study the impacts of raising the compulsory public school attendance age from 16 to 17 or 18. In its study, the Board of Governors shall consider all of the following:	
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(4) What would be the fiscal impact in raising the compulsory school attendance age from 16 to 17 and 16 to 18, respectively, for each local administrative school unit in North Carolina.

SECTION 2. No later than November 15, 2008, the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall submit a report of its study to the Joint Legislative Commission on Dropout Prevention and High School Graduation and the

- 3 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
