7 8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 143C-1-2(b) reads as rewritten: 10 Reversions. - Unless otherwise provided by law, at the end of the fiscal year "(b) the unexpended, unencumbered balance of an appropriation reverts to the fund from 11 12 which the appropriation was made; except that (i) an appropriation to the General Assembly shall not revert unless otherwise provided by the Legislative Services 13 14 Commission, (ii) an appropriation to the Judicial Department shall not revert unless otherwise provided by the Director of the Administrative Office of the Courts or the 15 Director of Indigent Defense Services, as applicable, (iii) an appropriation for a capital 16 improvement project shall revert as provided by G.S. 143C-8-11, and (iii) (iv) an 17 appropriation for the implementation of information technology (IT) projects shall not 18 19 revert until the project is implemented or abandoned."

20 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 143C-6-4 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 21 "(e1) Overexpenditures in the Judicial Department budget. – The Chief Justice may 22 approve expenditures for more than was authorized in the enacted budget for objects or 23 line items in the budget of the Judicial Department."
