2	AN ACT TO SHORTEN THE DURATION AND AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS
3	FOR A MOTORCYCLE LEARNER'S PERMIT, AND CLARIFY THE
4	REQUIREMENTS FOR OBTAINING A MOTORCYCLE ENDORSEMENT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-7(a1) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a1) Motorcycles and Mopeds. – To drive a motorcycle, a person shall have: have
8	one of the following:
9	(1) A full provisional license with a motorcycle learner's permit; permit.
10	(2) A regular drivers license with a motorcycle learner's <del>permit; or permit.</del>
11	(3) Either:
12	a. A full provisional license; or license, with a motorcycle
13	endorsement.
14	<del>b.</del>
15	(4) A regular drivers license, with a motorcycle endorsement.
16	To obtain a motorcycle endorsement, a person shall demonstrate competence to
17	drive a motorcycle by:
18	(1) Passing a road test;
19	(2) Passing a written or oral test concerning motorcycles; and
20	(3) Paying the fee for a motorcycle endorsement.
21	Neither a drivers license nor a motorcycle endorsement is required to drive a moped.
22	To obtain a motorcycle endorsement, a person shall demonstrate competence to
23	drive a motorcycle by passing a riding skills test administered by the Division, or by
24	providing proof of successful completion of the North Carolina Motorcycle Safety
25	Education Program Basic Rider Course or Experienced Rider Course. The person shall
26	pay the fee set in subsection (i) of this section for a motorcycle endorsement. Subsection
27	(a2) of this section sets forth the requirements for a motorcycle learner's permit. <u>Neither</u>
28	a drivers license nor a motorcycle endorsement is required to drive a moped."
20	SECTION 2 G S 20.7(a2) reads as rewritten:

29 SECTION 2. G.S. 20-7(a2) reads as rewritten:

1	"(a2) Motorcycle Learner's Permit. – The following persons are eligible for a
2	motorcycle learner's permit:
3	(1) A person who is at least 16 years old but less than 18 years old and has
4	a full provisional license issued by the Division.
5	(2) A person who is at least 18 years old and has a license issued by the
6	Division.
7	To obtain a motorcycle learner's permit, an applicant shall pass a vision test, a road
8	sign test, and a written test specified by the Division. An applicant who is less than 18
9	years old, or any applicant who has held a valid drivers license for less than two years,
10	shall successfully complete the North Carolina Motorcycle Safety Education Program
11	Basic Rider Course. A motorcycle learner's permit expires 18 months six months after it
12	is issued. issued and may be renewed for one additional six-month period. The holder of
13	a motorcycle learner's permit may not drive a motorcycle with a passenger. The fee for a
14	motorcycle learner's permit is the amount set in G.S. 20-7(1) for a learner's permit."
15	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective October 1, 2007.
