16	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
17	SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-104(a)(3) reads as rewritten:
18	"(3) Fine the permittee up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) one thousand
19	dollars (\$1,000) for the first violation, up to seven hundred fifty dollars
20	(\$750.00) one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) for the second
21	violation, and up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) two thousand
22	dollars (\$2,000) for the third violation; or".
23	SECTION 2. G.S. 18B-104(b) reads as rewritten:
24	"(b) Compromise. – In any case in which the Commission is entitled to suspend or
25	revoke a permit, the Commission may accept from the permittee an offer in compromise
26	to pay a penalty of not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) twenty-five-thousand

dollars (\$25,000). The Commission may either accept a compromise or revoke a permit, 27

5	SECTION 5. G.S. 18B-903(b1) reads as rewritten:
6	"(b1) Registration. – Each person holding a malt beverage, fortified wine, or
7	unfortified wine permit issued pursuant to $G.S. 18B-902(d)(1)$ through
8	G.S. 18B-902(d)(6) shall register by May 1 of each year on a form provided by the

9 10	Commission, in order to provide information needed by the State in enforcing this Chapter and to support the posts of that enforcement. The registration required by this
10	Chapter and to support the costs of that enforcement. The registration required by this subsection shall be accompanied by an annual registration and inspection fee of two
11	hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each permit held. The fee shall be paid by May 1 of each
12	year. A registration fee shall not be refundable. Failure to pay the annual registration
13 14	and inspection fee shall result in revocation of the permit a suspension of the permit
14 15	until the registration fee is received by the Commission and the permits are reinstated."
15 16	SECTION 6. G.S. 18B-1002(5) reads as rewritten:
10 17	"(5) A permit may be issued to a unit of local government, or to a nonprofit
17	organization or a political organization to sell or serve wine, malt
18 19	beverages, <u>mixed beverages,</u> and spirituous liquor at a ticketed event
20	held to allow the unit of local government or organization to raise
20	funds. For purposes of this subdivision "nonprofit organization" means
$\frac{21}{22}$	an organization that is exempt from taxation under Section $501(c)(3)$,
22	501(c)(4), 501(c)(6), 501(c)(8), 501(c)(10), 501(c)(19), or 501(d) of
23 24	the Internal Revenue Code or is exempt under similar provisions of the
24 25	General Statutes as a bona fide nonprofit charitable, civic, religious,
25 26	fraternal, patriotic, or veterans' organization or as a nonprofit volunteer
20 27	fire department, or as a nonprofit volunteer rescue squad or a bona fide
28	homeowners' or property owners' association. For purposes of this
20 29	subdivision "political organization" means an organization covered by
30	the provisions of G.S. $163-96(a)(1)$ or (2) or a campaign organization
31	established by or for a person who is a candidate who has filed a notice
32	of candidacy, paid the filing fees or filed the required petition, and
33	been certified as a candidate. The issuance of this permit will also
34	allow the issuance of a purchase-transportation permit under
35	G.S. 18B-403 and 18B-404 and the use for culinary purposes of
36	spirituous liquor lawfully purchased for use in mixed beverages."
