BILL SUMMARY: Amends GS 20-79.2 by adding motorcycle manufacturers to the list of groups eligible to purchase transporter plates.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

- It is assumed that there will be a reduction of revenues for adding this category since the transporter plate costs ½ for a regular plate. The cost of the transporter plate to the customer is \$14.00. Additionally, the transporter plate is sold to a customer instead of a vehicle, so DMV does not know to which vehicles the plates are issued and cannot track these vehicles if the insurance lapses which could potentially cause a reduction in revenues.
- It is unknown how many plates for customers would be subject to this act; therefore, the projected loss of revenues is unknown.

- There may be a small charge to create the mini-sized transporter plate; the Department of Corrections charges Division of Motor Vehicles \$100 per new plate created. The new plates may be subject to this charge.
- There will be information technology charges for computer upgrades and programming in the amount of \$35,488.
