31	for accreditation by the Council of Social Work Education, or (iii) has not received a doctora	te
32	in social work, shall not use the title 'Social Worker' or any variation of the title.

SECTION 4. Review of State Personnel Social Work Series. – The Office of State
Personnel shall conduct a review of the State Personnel Social Work Series every four years.
The review shall consist of an examination of the job title, duties, salary structure, supervision,
and requirements of classifications within the State Personnel Social Work Series. The
following entities shall participate in the review:
(1) The North Carolina Association of County Directors of Social Services.
(2) The National Association of Social Workers – North Carolina Chapter.
(3) The North Carolina Social Work Certification and Licensure Board.
(4) The North Carolina Society of Clinical Social Work.
(5) The North Carolina Society of Social Work Leadership in Healthcare.
(6) The Public Health Social Work Continuing Education and Training
Advisory Committee.
(7) The North Carolina School Social Work Association.
(8) A representative of a school of social work bachelor's degree program, as
determined by the National Association of Social Workers – North Carolina
Chapter Board of Directors.
(9) A representative of a school of social work master's degree program, as
determined by the National Association of Social Workers – North Carolina
Chapter Board of Directors.
(10) A representative from the Office of State Personnel.
After conducting the review, the Office of State Personnel shall submit a report to the
Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services by January 15 of

- 24 the year following the review.
- 25 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
