1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A NORTH CAROLINA RESIDENT, WHO ENLISTS IN
3	THE MILITARY AND WHO, UPON RECEIVING AN HONORABLE DISCHARGE,
4	RETURNS TO NORTH CAROLINA WITH THE INTENT OF REESTABLISHING
5	STATE RESIDENCY IS ELIGIBLE FOR IN-STATE TUITION WITHOUT FIRST
6	SATISFYING THE TWELVE-MONTH RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT IN CERTAIN
7	CIRCUMSTANCES.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 116-143.1(h) reads as rewritten:
10	"(h) No person shall lose his or her resident status for tuition purposes solely by reason
11	of serving in the armed forces outside this State. Any person who is a resident of North
12	Carolina at the time he or she enlists in the armed forces and who returns to North Carolina
13	within 30 days of being honorably discharged from the armed services for the purpose of
14	reestablishing residency and maintaining a bona fide domicile in the State and who enrolls in a
15	constituent institution not later than 90 days after being honorably discharged from the armed
16	services is eligible for in-State tuition without first satisfying the 12-month durational
17	requirement of this section. However, the eligibility for in-State tuition shall discontinue if the
18	person fails to continuously maintain the reestablished North Carolina domicile for a 12-month
19	period from the date of enrollment or if the person abandons legal residence in this State."
20	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009, and applies to the fall
21	2009-2010 academic semester and each subsequent academic semester.
