## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO DESIGNATE THE NORTH CAROLINA BLUEBERRY FESTIVAL HELD IN
  BURGAW AS THE OFFICIAL STATE BLUEBERRY FESTIVAL.
  Whereas, the first blueberry cultivation in North Carolina began in Pender County;
  - Whereas, the first blueberry cultivation in North Carolina began in Pender County; and
- 6 Whereas, in 1936, Harold Huntington of Cooperstown, New York, bought 1,000 7 acres of land between the Towns of Atkinson and Ivanhoe and planted blueberry bushes that he 8 brought from New Jersey; and
- 9 Whereas, today, there are more than 2,900 harvestable acres of blueberries in the 10 State with an estimated value of over \$43 million; and
- 11 Whereas, the North Carolina Blueberry Festival, which celebrates the historical, 12 economic, and cultural significance of blueberries in southeastern North Carolina, has become 13 an annual event; Now, therefore,
- 14 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- 15 SECTION 1. Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
  16 section to read:
- 17 "<u>§ 145-30. State Blueberry Festival.</u>
- 18 <u>The North Carolina Blueberry Festival held in the Town of Burgaw is adopted as the</u>
  19 <u>official blueberry festival of the State of North Carolina.</u>"
- 20 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
