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4 **SECTION 4.** The Committee shall submit a final report to the 2011 Regular 5 Session of the General Assembly and may submit interim reports as it deems necessary. The 6 Committee shall terminate upon filing its final report or upon the convening of the 2011 7 General Assembly, whichever comes first.

**SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
