2 AN ACT TO CREATE NEW MOTOR VEHICLE TITLING AND REGISTRATION 3 CATEGORIES FOR MOTOR VEHICLES CLASSIFIED AS CUSTOM-BUILT 4 VEHICLES, REPLICA VEHICLES, AND STREET RODS, TO REQUIRE AN 5 ADDITIONAL THIRTY-DOLLAR REGISTRATION FEE TO SUPPORT THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES BUREAU OF LICENSE AND THEFT MOTOR 6 7 VEHICLE EXAMINATION PROGRAM, AND TO MAKE CORRESPONDING 8 CHANGES. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 SECTION 1. G.S. 20-4.01(33) reads as rewritten: 11 Flood Vehicle. - A motor vehicle that has been submerged or "(33) a. partially submerged in water to the extent that damage to the body, 12 engine, transmission, or differential has occurred. 13 14 Non-U.S.A. Vehicle. - A motor vehicle manufactured outside of the b. United States and not intended by the manufacturer for sale in the 15 United States. 16 17 Reconstructed Vehicle. – A motor vehicle of a type required to be c. 18 registered hereunder that has been materially altered from original construction due to removal, addition or substitution of new or used 19 20 essential parts; and includes glider kits and custom assembled vehicles.parts such that it is no longer visually identifiable as a 21 generally recognized manufacturer-built vehicle. 22 Salvage Motor Vehicle. - Any motor vehicle damaged by collision 23 d. 24 or other occurrence to the extent that the cost of repairs to the vehicle and rendering the vehicle safe for use on the public streets and 25 highways would exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of its fair retail 26 market value, whether or not the motor vehicle has been declared a 27 total loss by an insurer. Repairs shall include the cost of parts and 28 labor. Fair market retail values shall be as found in the NADA 29 30 Pricing Guide Book or other publications approved by the Commissioner. 31 32 Salvage Rebuilt Vehicle. – A salvage vehicle that has been rebuilt for e. 33 title and registration.

21	other occurrence, that is to be retitled in this State, shall be subject to preliminary and final		
22	inspections by the Enforcement SectionLicense and Theft Bureau of the Division. For purposes		
23	of this section, the term "six model years" shall be calculated by counting the model year of the		
24 25	vehicle's manufacture as the first model year and the current calendar year as the final model		
25	year.		
26	These inspections serve as antitheft measures and do not certify the safety or		
27	road-worthiness of a vehicle."		
28 29	SECTION 7. G.S. 20-71.4(a)(2) reads as rewritten:		
	"(2) Transfer a motor vehicle when the transferor has knowledge that the vehicle		
30 31	is, or was, a flood vehicle, a reconstructed vehicle, a specially constructed vehicle, or a salvage motor vehicle, without disclosing that fact in writing to		
32	the transferee prior to the transfer of the vehicle."		
32 33	SECTION 8. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to
