## **Department of Justice**

The Department of Justice (DOJ) staff reports to Fiscal Research that the agency does not anticipate a significant fiscal impact resulting from the implementation of this bill, however, if DOJ's budget is significantly reduced there may no longer have the resources to cover the requirements of this bill. DOJ currently performs similar educational and public services functions within their Consumer Protection Division and the Department believes that the requirements of this bill can be performed with those existing resources. If this bill is enacted into law, DOJ will monitor the fiscal impact resulting from this bill and will seek expansion funds if it is determined that additional funds are necessary to effectively carry out the requirements of this bill.
