A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE EFFICIENCY AND COST				
3	SAVINGS IN STATE GOVERNMENT STUDY COMMISSION, AS RECOMMENDED				
4	BY THE LRC COMMITTEE ON EFFICIENCIES IN STATE GOVERNMENT.				
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
6	SECTION 1. There is established the Joint Legislative Efficiency and Cost				
7	Savings in State Government Study Commission.				
8	SECTION 2. The Commission shall be composed of 10 members appointed as				
9	follows:				
10	(1) Five senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.				
11	(2) Five representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of				
12	Representatives.				
13	Vacancies on the Commission shall be filled by the appointing authority. The				
1/	President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Sneaker of the House of Representatives shall				

President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shalleach designate a cochair. A quorum of the Commission shall be a majority of its members.

16 The Commission may meet at any time upon call of the chairs. The Commission 17 may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building. The Commission may 18 contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.

The Commission, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them, and the power to subpoena witnesses and documents.

24 The Director of the Fiscal Research Division shall advise and provide staff support 25 to assist the Commission in its work. The Director of the Program Evaluation Division shall advise the Commission. The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative 26 27 Services Officer, shall assign other professional staff to assist the Commission in its work. The 28 House of Representatives' and Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical 29 staff to the Commission, and the expenses relating to the clerical employees shall be borne by 30 the Commission. Members of the Commission shall receive subsistence and travel expenses at 31 the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.

32 **SECTION 3.** The Commission shall use a zero-based budgeting review process to 33 study whether there are obsolete programs, cost-reduction opportunities in State government, 34 and any cases where existing funds can be redirected to meet new and changing demands for 35 public services. At its first meeting, the Commission shall determine which agency or agencies

4	The Commission may require information as follows:				
5	(1)	Identification of decision units. – The agency shall identify decision units			
6	(1)	representing any group of services with a common set of objectives or			
7		comprising an agency program or administrative support unit.			
8	(2)	Impact of discontinuing each decision unit. – The agency shall provide a			
9	(2)	quantitative estimate of any adverse impacts that could reasonably be			
10		expected should the State discontinue a decision unit, together with a full			
11		description of the methods by which the adverse impact is estimated.			
12	(3)	Division of decision units into decision packages. – The agency shall divide			
13	(0)	each decision unit into the following four discrete decision packages:			
14		a. Minimum. – A quantitative estimate of any adverse impacts that			
15		could reasonably be expected and an itemized account of			
16		expenditures that would be required to maintain the activity at the			
17		minimum level of service required by any statutory authorization and			
18		below which would effectively eliminate all services, together with a			
19		concise statement of the resulting quantity and quality of services.			
20		This service level shall be below the level described by			
21		sub-subdivision b. of this subdivision.			
22		b. Reduced. – A quantitative estimate of any adverse impacts that could			
23		reasonably be expected and an itemized account of expenditures that			
24		would be required if funding were reduced by the percentage or			
25		amount specified by the Commission below the current level as			
26		defined by sub-subdivision c. of this subdivision and a concise			
27		statement of the resulting quantity and quality of services.			
28		c. Current A quantitative description of benefits from and an			
29		itemized account of expenditures that would be required to maintain			
30		the activity at the current level of service, together with a full			
31		description of the methods by which the current level is determined			
32		and a concise statement of the resulting quantity and quality of			
33		services.			
34		d. Enhanced. – A quantitative estimate of benefits that could reasonably			
35		be expected and an itemized account of expenditures that would be			
36		required to increase the current level of service, together with a full			
37		description of the methods by which the enhanced level is estimated			
38		and a concise statement of the resulting quantity and quality of			
39		services.			
40	(4)	Service delivery alternatives For each decision package, a description of			
41		alternative methods for delivering services which may include, but not be			
42		limited to, shedding one or more services and relying upon the free market			
43		for delivery, delegation to another level of government, using Requests for			
44		Information or competitive selection to outsource to private for-profit or			
45		nonprofit organizations, in whole or in part, including franchising, assisting			
46		or providing incubator arrangements for current State employees to form			
47		non-State organizations to compete for outsourcing opportunities, or through			
48		methods used by other states or nations.			
49 50	(5)	Ranking. – As instructed by the Commission, a ranking of all decision			
50		packages compared with each other without ties.

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1 **SECTION 4.** The Commission shall make an interim report to the 2013 Regular 2 Session of the 2013 General Assembly and shall make a final report to the 2014 Regular 3 Session of the General Assembly. The reports may include any proposed legislation. The 4 Commission shall terminate upon filing its final report or upon the convening of the 2014 5 Regular Session of the General Assembly, whichever is earlier.

6 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
