These vehicles must be able to travel at 15 the posted speed limit while operating in the HOV lane." 16 17 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 20-183.2(b) reads as rewritten: Emissions. – A motor vehicle is subject to an emissions inspection in accordance 18 19

with this Part if it meets all of the following requirements:

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(9) It is not a plug-in electric vehicle as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(28a)."

**SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
