13	conditions:	
14	<u>(1)</u>	Has completed a military program of training, been awarded a military
15		occupational specialty, and performed in that specialty at a level that is
16		substantially equivalent to or exceeds the requirements for licensure,
17		certification, or registration of the occupational licensing board for which the
18		applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in this State.
19	<u>(2)</u>	Has engaged in the active practice of the occupation for which the person is
20		seeking a license, certification, or permit from the occupational licensing
21		board in this State for at least two of the five years preceding the date of the
22		application under this section.
23	<u>(3)</u>	Has not committed any act in any jurisdiction that would have constituted
24		grounds for refusal, suspension, or revocation of a license to practice that
25		occupation in this State at the time the act was committed.
26	<u>(4)</u>	Pays any fees required by the occupational licensing board for which the
27		applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in this State.
28		ithstanding any other provision of law, an occupational licensing board, as
29		3B-1, shall issue a license, certification, or registration to a military spouse to
30		y spouse to lawfully practice the military spouse's occupation in this State if,

	grounds for refusal, suspension, or revocation of a license to practice t
	occupation in this State at the time the act was committed.
(4)	Is in good standing and has not been disciplined by the agency that h
	jurisdiction to issue the license, certification, or permit.
<u>(5)</u>	Pays any fees required by the occupational licensing board for which
	applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in this State.

<u>(d)</u> <u>A nor</u>	resident licensed, certified, or registered under this section shall be entitled
the same rights a	nd subject to the same obligations as required of a resident licensed, certifi
or registered by a	n occupational licensing board in this State.
<u>(e)</u> Nothi	ng in this section shall be construed to apply to the practice of law as regula
under Chapter 84	of the General Statutes.
<u>(f)</u> <u>An o</u>	ccupational licensing board may issue a temporary practice permit to
military-trained	applicant or military spouse licensed, certified, or registered in anot
jurisdiction whi	le the military-trained applicant or military spouse is satisfying
requirements for	licensure under subsection (a) or (b) of this section if that jurisdiction
licensure, certifi	ation, or registration standards substantially equivalent to the standards
licensure, certifi	cation, or registration of an occupational licensing board in this State. 7

SECT	TON 2. Within one year from the effective date of this act, each occupatio
licensing board i	egulating an occupation in this State and subject to the provisions of Char
93B of the Gene	al Statutes shall implement the requirements of G.S. 93B-15.1, as enacted
