16	(c)	Annual Testing Program.	
17		(1) The State Board of Education shall adopt a system of annual testingthe tests	
18		for grades three through 12.12 that are required by federal law or as a	
19		condition of a federal grant. These tests shall be designed to measure	
20		progress toward reading, communication skills, and mathematics for grades	
21		three through eight, and toward competencies designated by the State Board	
22		for grades nine through 12. The State Board may develop and implement a	
23		plan for high school end-of-course tests that must be aligned with the content	
24		standards developed under G.S. 115C-12(9c). Students who do not pass the	
25		tests adopted for eighth grade shall be provided remedial instruction in the	
26		ninth grade.	
27		(2) If the State Board of Education finds that additional testing in grades three	
28		through 12 is desirable to allow comparisons with national indicators of	
29		student achievement, that testing shall be conducted with the smallest size	
30		sample of students necessary to assure valid comparisons with other states.	
31	<u>(d)</u>	Except as provided in subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of this section, the State	
32		Education shall not require the public schools to administer any standardized tests	
33		those required by federal law or as a condition of a federal grant.
