Definitions. 7 The following definitions apply in this Part: Cash card system. — A system of payment that captures a photograph of a 8 (1)9 payment recipient and that provides payment in cash or in a form other than cash.cash and that when providing payment in the form of cash (i) captures a 10 photograph of the seller at the time payment is received and (ii) uses an 11 automated cash dispenser, including, but not limited to, an Automated Teller 12 13 Machine. Fixed site. — A site occupied by a secondary metals recycler as the owner of 14 (2)the site or as a lessee of the site under a lease or other rental agreement 15 providing for occupation of the site by a nonferrous metals purchaser for a 16 17 total duration of not less than 364 days. Law enforcement officer. - Any duly constituted law enforcement officer 18 (3) of the State or of any municipality or county. 19 Nonferrous metals. — Metals not containing significant quantities of iron or 20 (4) steel, including, but not limited to, copper wire, copper clad steel wire, 21 22 copper pipe, copper bars, copper sheeting, aluminum other than aluminum cans, a product that is a mixture of aluminum and copper, catalytic 23 24 converters, lead-acid batteries, and stainless steel beer kegs or containers. 25 The term shall not include precious metals as defined and regulated in Part 2 26 of this Article. 27 Nonferrous metals purchaser. — A secondary metals recycler who (5) 28 purchases, gathers, or obtains nonferrous metals.
